Sitting with a group of people having coffee, I listened as they spoke about one person or another. Nothing mean; no gossip – just friendly reminiscing.

A name came up – someone I didn't know. I was told what the person did before retiring and something they said that offended many people. Then, the conversation went on to other things.

That little snippet haunted me.

I'm one who has said something that upset others. I've been angry; felt defensive; or, spoke too quickly. I know what it's like to see words float out of your mouth with the impossibility of taking them back.

I've tasted guilt, embarrassment and regret. Even after I apologize, those feelings linger.

On the flipside, I know what it feels like to have something spoken that rings and dings in the ears.

We all need to be more careful and guarded in what we say, text and post on social media.

As we work on this, I wonder how long do we hold someone prisoner to their past wrongdoing? How long do we want to be held prisoner ourselves?

At what point do we see a wrongdoing as a springboard for improvement and not a hammer to punish?

We discolor each other by remembering and bringing up what God has nailed to the cross.

I'm most comfortable during the Season of Lent because it's the season of imperfection, Uff Da's and Oh No's! A season relishing a God who refuses to dig up dirt and post it; a God who literally wipes our slate clean – our responsibility is to confess and repent.

Yes, we've said and done things we're not proud of. Yes, we've left unspoken and undone what's good and helpful. How long do we want people to talk about it? Wouldn't it be awesome if people complimented or kept silent instead?

Go and speak likewise.

Unfinished Business: none

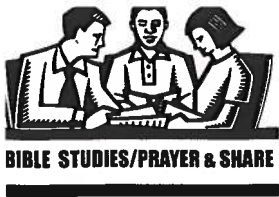
New Business:

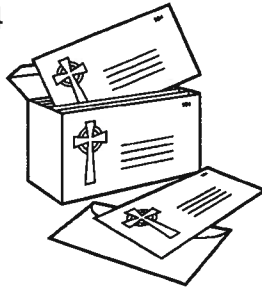

Steffen called the meeting to order. New council members Cheryl Lund and Dawson Staples were welcomed.

Clem motioned to approve the agenda. Tom 2nd. Approved.

VISITOR REPORTS: None

PASTORAL REPORT: Pastor discussed the need for accountability and ownership when our youth are looking to apply for camperships and scholarships. Need youth and families to understand active participation in the life of the congregation is a guideline for receiving both camperships and scholarships. Council discussed what this looks like – active in worship and Sunday School for younger kids and active in worship and service (similar to confirmation expectations) for older kids. Those receiving camperships are expected to participate in fundraising efforts.

Pastor shared that he has heard from many people (in light of the current economy, etc) that they would like to see more local involvement in missions/service projects from our congregation. He asked council to support making this a focus for 2026. Would like to do quarterly local service/mission projects including the entire congregation (and possibly the Parish). Habitat for Humanity build is already planned. Council was supportive of this focus. Pastor will share with congregation at Annual Meeting. This is planned over and above Grace Beyond Our Doors/Noisy Offerings plans.

Pastor presented information made available from the NW MN Synod office about what to do in light of Immigration Enforcement visit. Pastor and Kelli will act together as the voice for Grace congregation if there is a visit. Procedures were reviewed with council.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Tom motioned to approve minutes as presented. Tina 2nd. Approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Kelli presented financials and did a brief overview of how to read the reports for new members. We ended 2025 in good financial position. The audit of the 2025 financials was completed and found to be in good condition. Don motioned to approve. Clem 2nd. Approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

•Mold in Pre-school Sunday School Room: Master Builders will begin working on the project.

•Annual Meeting: Reports are ready and in mailboxes. Plans reviewed with council. Erin and Brenda will lead.

NEW BUSINESS:

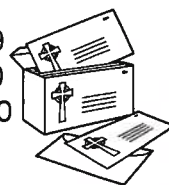

This winter we have seen temperature swings from -20 up to over 40 degrees. Luckily for me (and most of us) we can choose if we are going to work or play outside when the air is frigid and the wind is biting or take advantage of our toasty homes. Unfortunately, many of our homeless neighbors do not have the option to stay in a warm house curled up with a book or good movie or games with our kids. In the Fargo-Moorhead area, Churches United provides a warm place to land for the night and maybe receive a good meal or other daily supplies necessary to do life.

Churches United is supported by over 100 churches in the F-M area. Their mission is to provide safe shelter, stable housing, nutritious food, and a path for healing. To this end they operate Micah's Mission which provides emergency shelter, the Dorothy Day Food Pantry, Silver Linings Apartments which consists of 36 units for very low-income seniors, Bright Sky Apartments which has 43 units for families and individuals, and case managers to assist those navigating homelessness and food insecurity.

Please help support this amazing organization with our Noisy Offering this month. We also are collecting supplies that are needed for Micah's Mission and the food pantry. A list of their most requested items at this time is listed below and on the church bulletin board. There is also a list on their website. We will be augmenting donations with a Thrivent Action Team card and will deliver these items later in February.

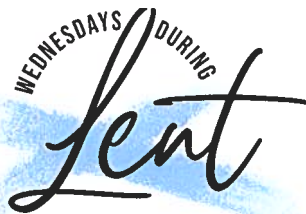
