HABITAT FOR HUMANITY DOUGLAS COUNTY (HFHDC)

Our Grace congregation has been one of the most steadfast supporters of HFHDC all the churches in the county. The HFH staff likes to remind us of this and has always been so grateful for our involvement. We have built houses, raised money, provided meals and snacks, and welcomed work crews to our fellowship hall to eat and take a break from the heat.

We're going to continue this tradition this year by taking part in the Faith Build again. **Our work day will be June 12** and we will be working on the exterior. It sounds like about the same work that we did last year in beautiful weather. There will be a sign-up to work a little later so please watch for it if you want to be part of the crew (*Faith volunteers are welcome and encouraged to join us again!*)

Our noisy offering in May will be for the Habitat build. In the meantime, please pray for the families who will be living in these new homes, that they will feel the security we feel in our own homes and they will feel the love and support that surrounds them by our community.

The menu: pickles, pickle juice, root beer, water, flaming hot Doritos, rippled potato chips and Oreos. Raiding my candy bowl is a bonus (unless I forgot to hide it or, lock my office).

Those are the most requested after school snacks from the Club 828 crew (Faith).

They think it's funny watching my reaction as they drink pickle juice and dunk the Oreos or other chips to "experiment" with the taste. My stomach churns!

Our weekly conversations are spirited; their enthusiasm outshines the Energizer bunny; not a Wednesday goes by without laughter.

God gets a kick out of kids. They erupt at the silliest things – making a funny face, a joke, breaking out into a game of tag or playing with food.

The younger ones are "love experts" – bursting into our days with ready hugs, regardless of our size or color.

Kids have a "master's degree" in being undaunted. Sporting costumes, capes, tiaras; swirling wands and swords, they forge unknown empires to fight the "bad guy" and always win.

Unfortunately, as we "grow up", we forget the lessons of play. Whether we've become discouraged or disquieted, imaginary friends and "knock, "knock" jokes are best left in preschool.

The empty tomb wants to resurrect the child in all of us – pure joy, ready love and spontaneity.

In a world ready to cry out, "prejudice, indifference and judgement", our attention is drawn Heavenward – learning not to take this life too seriously.

Yes, we have our wars, chaos at the border, health worries, (the list goes on). The thunderous "Aha!" of Resurrection morning, beckons us to borrow the psalmist's words, "weeping may stay for the night, but rejoicing comes in the morning". (Psalm 30:5)

To laugh with God is not saying everything is funny or should be. It's keeping a playful, buoyant spirit within – knowing the same God who brought His Son to life, is the same God who, like children, forges "empires" to fight the bad guy and wins!

If God wins, we do, too!

Together with God, we'll always have the last and eternal laugh! (without pickle juice)

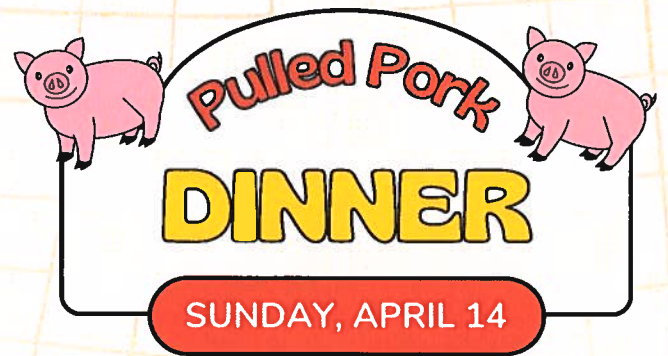

VISITOR REPORTS: None

PASTORAL REPORT: Pastor reported that he has heard back from several who would like to participate in a Bible Study. Plans to start following Easter. Preference was to have it daytime hours during the work week.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Terrill motioned to approve minutes as presented. Erin 2nd. Approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Brenda presented financials for February. Giving was down below our budgeted needs for a second month. She highlighted several expenses for the month, noting the large distribution from the Building Fund to pay for the shingles for the roof project. Erin motion to approve. Kim 2nd. Approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

•Passion for Jesus Item Orders: Orders are coming in for these items. Kelli will submit next week. Discussion on whether or not we should consider purchasing t-shirts for youth in the congregation.

•MN Sick Leave Law – Carryover Allowed Each Year: No further discussion on this. Erin will reach out to several of the congregations in Alexandria to see what their policies state and will report back in April.

•Board of Ed Council Position: Still looking for someone to help out with this. Brainstormed for some good candidates. Council asked to reach out to anyone they think would be a good fit.

•Men's Dinner: Art Vinson has agreed to spearhead this year's Men's Dinner. It will be held April 14. We will plan on having a lay-led service at 11 am that day, with Pastor recording a message for the screen. Meal will start following worship and run through 2 pm. Menu will be pulled pork and sides. Kelli will put together posters and get worker sign-ups ready.

•VBS (Bible Camp Leaders): Coley has coordinated workers from Lutheran Island Camp to come and lead VBS. Dates will be August 5 through 7 from 5 to 8:30 pm. Cost for leaders/mileage is currently \$866.58. They will connect with us regarding craft projects and additional cost if they pick up the necessary supplies.

NEW BUSINESS:

•Habitat for Humanity Build: GBOD is proposing we participate in the Habitat for Humanity Faith Build again this year. Grace's commitment will be \$750. Faith is also being invited to participate. Our build day is set for June 12. May's Noisy Offering will go toward our commitment. Terrill made the motion to approve participation and support from the Mission Fund for \$750 toward the build. Eric 2nd. Approved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

DEACON'S REPORT: Pastor will be working with the Deacons on Holy Humor Sunday (1st Sunday after Easter)

BOARD OF EDUCATION: Still need several people to help with the float for SummerFest Parade. Eric will reach out to some people to see if they are willing to help.

TRUSTEE'S REPORT: Roofing work is tentatively scheduled for March 18 to 20 (weather permitting). Shingles have been purchased. We are expecting a generous anonymous donation to cover the remainder of the funds needed to complete the project.

- January: Sanford Children's Hospital Fargo, ND (research for children's cancer) donations triple at this time.

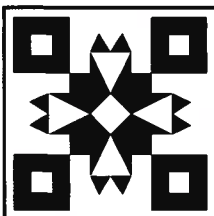

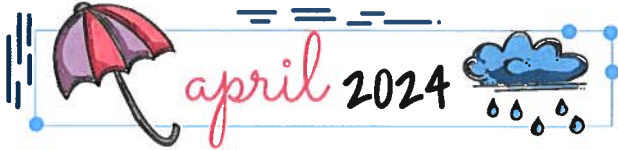

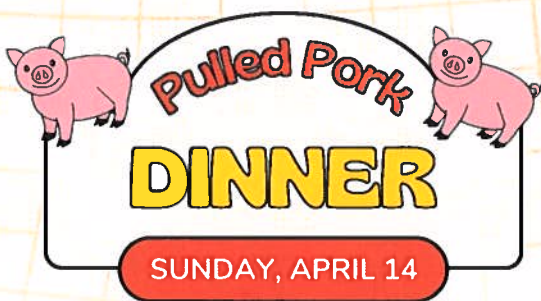
