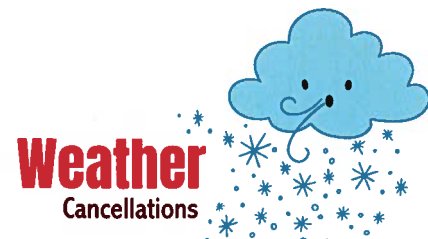

VISITOR REPORTS: None

PASTORAL REPORT: Pastor shared with council that he has had many conversations, within the Parish and our communities, sharing concerns and feelings of uncertainty and unease for the future. Pastor encouraged council to be aware of these feelings and to be sensitive to them as we move into the New Year.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Terrill motioned to approve minutes from November meeting, as well as from the Congregational Meeting as presented. Coley 2nd. Approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Brenda presented financials. Giving to the General Fund continues to be down for the month and the year, however we have made up some ground and it is hopeful that with 5 Sundays and Christmas in December we will come in on budget for the year. Erin motioned to approve. Kim 2nd. Approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

•**Musicians: 4th Sunday Coverage:** Both Pastor and Annette have been in conversation with people about coverage. Council gave Annette encouragement to move forward with the individual she has been visiting with.

•**Council Retreat:** We will have an extended meeting/retreat on Wednesday, January 8. We will meet at 6 pm instead of 8. Erin will work with Kelli on the agenda.

•**Parsonage Maintenance/Repairs:** Received a 2nd quote for the mini split. Amount is still restrictive based upon our budget. Will look into getting updated/more efficient window units instead. Clem is waiting on a quote for the painting. Sump pump will also be replaced.

NEW BUSINESS:

•**Approve Proposed Parish Budget 2025:** Kelli presented the Parish Budget as approved by Parish Council. Eric made a motion to approve. Clem 2nd. Approved.

•**Approve Proposed Grace Budget 2025:** Kelli presented Proposed Grace Budget for 2025. Budget committee recommends revenue Line Item "21 Parsonage Reimbursement" amount be split between building fund and general fund (with Grace's portion being paid in Expense Line Item "110 Parish Expense", going back into General Fund). Proposed budget is a deficit budget and will be presented to the congregation for their approval at the Annual Meeting. Terrill motion to approve as presented. Clem 2nd. Approved.

•**Annual Meeting, January 26, 2025:** Reviewed tasks and who will be in attendance.

•**Parish Council:** Erin made a motion to approve Erin Okerlund, Lon Burgess and Karen Wirtjes as Parish Council representatives for 2025. Coley 2nd. Approved.

•**Signature Card for 2025:** Erin made a motion to approve Erin Okerlund (President), Steffen Morical (VP), Brenda Trisko (Treas), Clem Roers (Trustee) and Tom Behlke (Trustee) as signors on the Grace Account. Terrill 2nd. Approved.

•**Grace Beyond Our Doors:** Terrill presented a request from GBOD to send \$2,000 from the mission fund to Lutheran World Relief in support of Hurricane Relief efforts in North Carolina and \$500 to West Central Communities Action for the Fuel Assistance Program. Erin made a motion. Clem 2nd. Approved.

•**Snowblower:** Clem followed up on a previous discussion of getting a small snowblower to help with snow removal at the church. Kim made a motion to spend up to \$400 on a used snow blower to keep at church to clear sidewalks. Erin 2nd. Approved.

•**Thank You!** Kelli thanked outgoing council members for their work and dedication on behalf of herself, Pastor Brad and the entire congregation.

December 8, 2024**



Next meeting is February 2 in the library following worship. All are welcome.

Present: Pat Freese, Diane Olson, Jean Nelson, Annette Helder, Terrill Morical, Chelsea Gasser, Pastor Brad, Michelle Olsen

Chelsea Gasser's son Nolan, a student at Bethel University in the Cities, is leading a mission team to Belize in March. He is able to come to speak about the trip on January 19. His trip will receive the Noisy Offering in February.

Our January Noisy Offering will be for Sanford Health Foundation in Fargo. They serve many children and adults from our local area. They would like to build a housing option for long-term patients and their families. Their Head of Philanthropy will speak on January 26 and we collect the Noisy offering at that time. There is a triple match for funds raised in January.

Pastor Brad spoke of several people who have expressed concerns to him about the change in administration and how it may affect them financially and in other ways. He suggested we keep in mind that giving may decrease if people are experiencing financial difficulty and that we should keep some money in the Mission Fund to use for future donations.

There is currently \$5,500 in the Mission Fund. We recommend \$2,000 be sent to Lutheran World Relief for hurricane relief work in western North Carolina. We also recommend sending \$500 to West Central Minnesota Communities Action for fuel assistance. This would be instead of using the February Noisy Offering for that cause. There will still be \$3,000 in the Mission Fund to cover upcoming mission requests.

Future Noisy Offerings (with committee member responsible for newsletter articles) - March: Helps International (Michelle); April: LifeSource organ donor facilitators (Jean); May: Habitat for Humanity Faith Build (Michelle); June: TBD (Annette will be contacting someone)

There will be no meeting in January.

Please sign up as you are able to help.

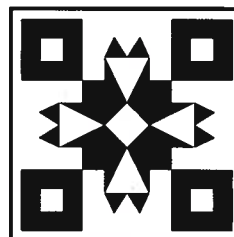
We are looking for a few men, women, or teen volunteers to help remove snow from our sidewalks!

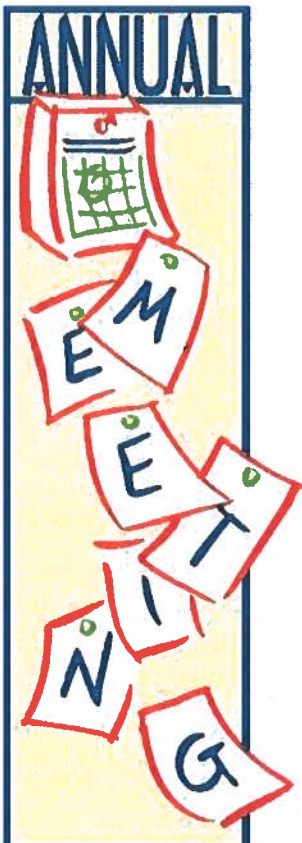
